All human rights for everyone

Third Assembly of young people's UN *“Young people in action for human rights and peace”*

The *III UN Assembly of young people* will take place in **Terni on the 5th and 6th October 2007** on the eve of the **60th anniversary of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights** and it will have the purpose of offering young people an open, accessible and crossable place where they can compare with other young people and prepare a program of actions in order to promote and defend human rights and peace.

Human rights are the civil, economic, social and cultural rights, the rights to peace, environment, human development, equal opportunities between men and women, dignity in work and a fair remuneration, which have to be realized in respect of the principle of their interdependence and indivisibility. The welfare State cannot be separated from the constitutional State. Social and economic democracy cannot be separated from political democracy.

The behaviour of men and women favours the application of rights and the positive development of relations.

Today the right of young people to imagine and build “the other possible world” and “to make a difference” is threatened at every latitude: **from the North to the South of the world young people are the victims and the protagonists of war, misery, environmental degrade, exploitation as well as they are the victims and protagonists of the dismantling of welfare state, consumerism, of the society of appearance, precariousness in work and life.**

Since years by now this generation of young people affirms that an other world is possible and when they declare it, they don't think of a far or future world, but the world whom all we have the responsibility to **build by means of our creativity, our wishes and engagement, a world free from wars**

and poverty where dignity, social justice and human rights are the core of the system of values that directs our choices.

The UNO of young people has a concrete and real aim: it is not the place of recollection, we do not intend just to know or list human rights, but we intend to **draw the map of our actions and the program of our interventions in the places we go through daily and where we are the protagonists** (school, university, territories, work, organizations...).

The UNO of young people will be the occasion to confirm how promoting and affirming human rights are strictly connected to the emergencies that come from young people's universe. For this very reason we will meet not to celebrate human rights, but to turn them, at the same time, into the needs and wishes and into the concrete objectives that will lead our daily actions and politics at every level.

We will build the alphabet of peace and the political agenda of human rights by means of the languages we know and which belong to us the most: through the music, the imagines, the new media, performance and art, narration, whom we will use as means of charge and tools for change.

Participation from the bottom, the desire to be a protagonist, circularity, informal approach, but also listening and the meeting with the actors of change in many parts of the world will be the forms that the Third UN Assembly of young people will privilege.

The assemblies will be the places of listening and knowledge, while through the workshops young people will commit their selves to defining a program of concrete actions; Terni will be the first territory to dialogue with by the sounds, the imaginaries and the signs of change.

As for the UNO of the Peoples, Africa, symbol of world justice demand, and the Middle East, symbol of unsolved conflicts and peace demand, will have a particular importance, without forgetting that peace does not mean just lack of war, but a world where all human rights are guaranteed for everyone.

ALL HUMAN RIGHTS FOR EVERYONE:

is the slogan that connects the UNO of the Peoples to the UNO of young people and both to the March from Perugia to Assisi, which is the conclusive moment of both assemblies, and it means that the time has come when to globalize human rights, justice, democracy and solidarity against every war and poverty.
